

COOPERSTOWN GETS THE R. R.

An Electric Road to be Built
from Grand Forks to Carrington. Will be Built
at Once.

Carrington Independent: Carrington is to be connected with Grand Forks and the east by an electric line by the way of Cooperstown, Sherbrooke and Mayville. The promoters of the enterprise will be on the ground today. The outlook is very bright for an electric line for Carrington. The Independent was in communication, by long distance phone, with the promoters of the Northwestern interurban railway during the week, and has received positive assurance that we are to have electric line connections with Grand Forks.

It certainly looks like a very good proposition for Carrington and Foster county, as the road will run east from Carrington about through the center of the county. The road traverses five counties, and will pass through four county seats on the way to Grand Forks.

The plan is to build the road from Grand Forks this way, and to reach Carrington some time during the early summer of 1908. The road, as planned, traverses the most thickly settled counties in the state, and the best farming counties in the state. This electric line will give the people along the route the benefit of light and heat, as well as furnish a freight and passenger service far superior to steam, besides giving a short cut to Grand Forks and the northeast. We understand that the promotion of the company is to be pushed with energy; that the surveyors are in the field now working this way from Grand Forks, and there is every

reason to believe that the proposed line will be built.

This proposed electric line is not to be thought of in connection with the line that has heretofore been suggested but is an entirely new enterprise, and as we understand it now, the line will take a course due west from Cooperstown. This line will be of inestimable value to the farmers living in the central part of the county, who are from nine to twelve miles from market, and who must drive a long distance to reach the county seat or any town of importance.
