

## Death of Mrs. Stork.

While it had been expected, the announcement of the death of Mrs. G. N. Stork which occurred between 5 and 6 o'clock p. m. last Sunday afternoon cast a gloom over our little city. The deceased had been a sufferer from cancer of the stomach for many months and had been a patient sufferer through it all. All that could possibly be done in the way of medical aid was done, but the dread malady could not be checked and death released her from her pain. Mrs. Stork was born in Boston, Mass., on July 22d, 1855, and was 46 years old last July. She and her sorrowing husband have been residents here for many years and the older settlers are indebted to her for many acts of kindness during her life. Only a heart-broken husband is left to mourn her departure and to him the loss is indeed hard. He has the sympathy of the whole community in his bereavement. The funeral took place in the Baptist church—of which she was a member—yesterday afternoon, Rev. Douglass of Aneta, preaching the sermon. The remains were interred in the cemetery at this place.
