

MICHAEL LOLACK, A LABORER, IS INSTANTLY KILLED.

At about 2 o'clock last Saturday afternoon a distressing accident took place at the Guthrie camp, one mile east of Hannaford, when a young man 19 years of age, named Michael Lolock, was instantly killed, his body being horribly mutilated. It seems that the young man was riding on a train of dump cars loaded with dirt, and was sitting on the side or end of one of the cars. As the train passed over a high place in the track, and the slack between the cars was taken up, he was thrown head foremost off the train and then rolled under the wheels, meeting instant death. His chin was cut off by the wheels, while his features and body were terribly bruised, both arms being broken in two places, leaving the bones protruding through the flesh.

Coroner L. Almklov, of Coopers-town, and Dr. C. A. Wicklund were immediately notified and hastened to the scene of the accident. After being viewed by the coroner, the remains of the unfortunate young man were brought to town and prepared for burial.

The funeral took place at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon from the Presbyterian church, being largely attended by our citizens and comrades of the deceased. Rev. Mackay, the pastor, preached a very impressive sermon. Interment was made in the cemetery just west of town.

Deceased leaves a brother, Steve, who is employed at the same camp, and his parents in the old country to mourn his sudden death. He is said by his associates to have been an exemplary young man, steady and industrious, and was well liked by all who knew him.
