## **OBITUARY**

Ole Borgerson was born February 6th, 1875, in Filimore County, Minnesota. He was reased on a farm, and engaged in the occupation of farming as he grew to manhood. When sixteen years of age he and his brothers, George and Halvor, now deceased, were compelled to assume the responsibilities of the farm work, their father having died at that time, leaving a widow, three sons and two daughters, Otilia and Alma.

In the fall of 1898 the family removed to Cooperstown, North Dakota, where the boys, Ole and Halvor, engaged in the livery business, in which business they continued until the fall of 1902 when Ole came to Binford and filed on a homestead, also accepting a position as clerk in a general store, which position he occupied until he was obliged, because of fail-ing health, to abandon it. His affliction was that dread disease, tuberculosis, which caused his death on the 5th day of June, 1906. He spent his latter days in the food hope that his ilfe might be spared for the sake of his widowed mother and his unmarricd sister, for whom he labored with constant cheerfulness as long as he was able. His devotion to his aged mother, together with his other good traits of character, had won for him the admiration of all who knew him.
