

Charles Fenner, a twelve-year-old boy, herding stock for Charles Rother, south of town, had his arm broken last Saturday, in the following manner: He was trying to lead a colt, and to make sure that the colt could not get away from him he tied the halter rope to his left arm. The colt was quite spirited and finally ran away, dragging the boy with him, and throwing him around in such a manner as to break his right arm, while the left arm escaped without injury except a little straining. It seems almost miraculous that the boy was not killed outright but, through some process his life was saved. Dr. Briml of Cooperstown, was summoned to reduce the fracture, it being a county case, and on Sunday Dr. Truscott went out to place the arm in a cast. At last accounts the boy was resting easily.
