The two boys in company with Art Ebentier and Ed Heistmann were hunting in the Church pasture, about two and a half miles from the Rhodes place. had stationed themselves at a large rock when a flock of geese flew over them. Mr. Gleisner raised his gun to shoot and just at that instant, Mr. Long, who was on the opposite side of the rock directly in line with Mr. Gleisner and the geese, raised up to take aim, and received the full charge in the head. death resulting instantly. Being at so close range his head was so badly lacerated that he was almost beyond recognition.

Coroner Westley being absent Justice Rearick, Sheriff Knapp and States Attorney Tufte went out from Cooperstown and at the hearing Mr. Gleisner was exoner-

ated of all blame.

The body was removed to Cooperstown where it was embalmed and shipped yesterday to the home of his parents in Kenosha,
