

### Obituary.

Sanborn Enterprise: Gertrude I. Grannis, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Chet Grannis, was born on the farm a few miles south of Sanborn, D. T., August 26, 1882, and died September 11, of tuberculosis, aged 27 years.

Her whole life, with the exception of a few months spent in

New Mexico, in the hope that the mild, dry atmosphere of that state might be of benefit to her, and a few weeks spent in Oregon in the same vain hope, was passed in this community.

She moved to town with her parents in the early days of the village and attended the village schools and the Sunday school and grew up to young womanhood in this vicinity. She was first married to Frank Cramer November 15, 1899, by whom she had one child, Chester Frank, who survives. After a short married life her husband died of tuberculosis.

On April 5, 1902, she was again married to Peter Reid, who, with her son, survives here. Shortly after her second marriage deceased developed symptoms of tuberculosis. She was taken to Rochester, where a tubercular tumor was removed and everything possible done by loving ones to stay the dread disease, but without avail. Prior to her first marriage she suffered a severe attack of lung fever, which left her lungs weak and from which she never fully recovered, having a permanent cough that refused to yield to treatment, and this doubtless made her more susceptible to tuberculosis. She lingered about seven years from the first appearance of the disease.

The funeral was held this (Thursday) afternoon, at 2 o'clock at the Congregational church, Rev. J. R. Beebe, of New Rockford, formerly of this place, officiating, assisted by Rev. H. C. Juell, and the body was buried in Fairview cemetery by the side of loved ones who had gone before.

A large number of friends are in attendance at the funeral which is now in progress, many of whom are from out of town, thus attesting by their presence their respect for the dead and sympathy for the surviving members of the family.

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
