Agent West informs us that 26,000 pounds were unloaded on the platform that day, besides two cars of merchandise that were set out on the side track—bringing the total weight up to 44,116 pounds. This is the largest amount of freight consigned to this point for any one day while Mr. West has had charge of the station. All of this merchandise was for local merchants, and is proof conclusively that Binford is the busiest little town on the branch.
