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a result of drinking carbolic acid by mistake instead of water in

Mr. Rosdal went into the store Mr. Rosdal went into the store and took a bottle that resembled a balf gallon water bottle and poured some of the contents into a glass, and must evidently nave gulped it down without stopping to taste it. Then he called Mr. Almklov, the druggist,

who was standing in front of the store, showed him the bottle and asked what it contained. When

informed that it was carbolic acid he collapsed. Although an acid he collapsed. Although an antidote was administered, and the doctor was called and arrived in a few minutes the heart had al-

ready stopped beating. At the inquest, at which Coroner Almklov of Cooperatown and Dr. C. A. Wickland were present, the following jury was impaneled: N. K. Markuson, John C. Stordahl, G. M. Aarestad and

Paul Troseth; the verdict found being to the effect that death was caused by the accidental taking of carbolic acid. day, it being on his birthday that day, it being on his birthday that he met his death. He had been a resident of this village for over seven years, working at his trade as a carpenter. He had spent the winter in Canada, where he owned a homestead, and came back to town about three weeks ago to spend the summer working at his trade in this neighborhood. Before coming to

He leaves, beside his wife and one son, two brothers Axel and Salve, who are making their home in Canada, and a sister, Gunhild. The bereaved family and relatives have the sincerest sympathy

of all in their great sorrow and bereavement. The funeral will be heldtoday, and interrment will be made in the cemetery north of Hannaford Enterprise.

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
