

RURAL ROUTE TO BE ESTABLISHED

Route Running North Will Be
Started by September
First.

Although Postmaster Lewis has not received official notification from the postoffice department relative to the new route north of town, dispatches in the twin city papers state the new route is to be established September first.

The people up north have been anxious for this route for a long time, the first petition having been sent in during the administration of former postmaster, O. S. Gunderson. Owing to some irregularities it was sent back, and has been hanging fire until about two months ago when the postoffice inspector went over the route with Postmaster Lewis, and recommended to the department that it be established.

The route will serve 73 families and is about 25 miles long. To commence with they will receive mail three times a week, but it is thought that it will be only a short time before they will be entitled to daily service. This, of course, is regulated by the amount of mail handled.

From the postoffice the route runs north a half mile, thence east a half mile, north five miles, west one and a half mile to Adrian farm, east a half mile, north one mile, east three miles, south two miles, east two miles, south three miles, west four miles, south one mile, west a half mile, and south a half mile to the postoffice.
