d Binford, you are bereby authorized and directed to increase the frequency of service on that route from three to six deliverlies a week, effective June 1, 1911.

Carrier Christian F. Heinsen, who is now serving routes Nos.

1 and 2 on alternate days, will be assigned to route No. 1. You will, without expense to the Department, advise the pamons of the proposed increase of frequency of service, and impress upon them the necessity of givt ing the route their liberal support

as failure to do so will necessar-rily operate to reduce the service. s to its present status. When you have complied with 4 , these instructions, you will notify the Department of your action.
