Notice of Leasing of School and State Lands.

The school and state lands in Griggs County, North Dakota, not already leased, will be offered for rent at a public leasing to be held at the court house in the city of Cooperstown, in said county, on Wednesday, the 10th day of April, 1912,

commencing at 11 o'clock, a. m. The terms of leasing will be as follows:

All lands will be offered for a term of five years beginning with the season of 1912, and only for grazing and hay purposes, at the minimum annual rental of fifteen dollars for each quarter section.

All lands will be struck off to the highest bidder, who will be required to pay at the time of leasing the rent for the season of 1912; also an additional fee of \$3.00 for issuing lease.
