Village Clerk Melgard received a communication from the D. S. B. Johnston Land company in regards to the extension of the Main street, south of the N. P. right-of-way. This street is one of the important ones leading to town and has been used for several years, though the village has had no right title to it. The residents in south Binford are badly in need of a sidewalk leading to their homes, but on account of the village not having a title to the street and not having a legal crossing over the N. P. tracks, until about a year ago, it was useless for them to build a walk bordering their property unless the walk could be connected with the one on the north side of the tracks. In consideration of the street right-of-way, the Johnston land people ask for a sum of \$100 and the transfer to them of the deed to the street west of Main street which was secured by the village, at the time the Great Western elevator was burned, which building was on the street and over which there was considerable litigation at the time. The matter will, no doubt, be disposed of at the next meeting of the village board.
