

A Mr. Mortenson, representing the Northern Pacific railway company, was here last week interviewing some of our farmers with reference to reserving a small plot of their farms for experimental purposes. The contract calls for a strict observance of the rules, the railway company to furnish the seed and fertilizer, and the farmer to work the land according to directions and receive the crop. These experimental plots have proven a success wherever established, and is done to show the farmers the result of better farming, and which, in many instances the yield is doubled and the quality improved. The experiment will be tried on the D. A. Goplin farm, and will be watched with interest.
