

DISTRICT COURT HAS ADJOURNED

**Entire Calendar Was Disposed of
Except the Case of State
vs. Wickham.**

The May term of the district court opened Monday, May 8, Judge J. A. Coffey presiding.

The case of Mike Peterson vs. Alfred Peterson was dismissed.

The case of Anton Fried vs. Tom O. Sad was settled out of court.

The petitions for naturalization of Nels Halyorson, B. P. Lind and Otto Knapp were granted.

Pat O'Shea of Binford pleaded guilty to the charge of assault and battery with a dangerous weapon. He was sentenced to four months at hard labor in the county jail.

The case of the state vs. Carl Brund was tried before the jury. The jury found him guilty and the judge sentenced him to pay \$300 in three installments of \$100 each. As he has not yet given security for the payment of his judgment, he lingers in the county jail where he will remain for three months unless security is put up. Even if he remains for three months in jail, he is still liable for the amount of the judgment.

The case of the state vs. E. S. Wickham was continued until next term on motion of the state's attorney.

The case of the state against Martin Nelson, the blacksmith, for allowing drinking in his shop was tried before a jury. After being out 19 hours the jury was dismissed as the members could not agree.

Mildred Dusbabeck was granted a divorce from Emil Dusbabeck.

Mary J. Perrin was granted a divorce from Edward C. Perrin.

Margaret A. Reynolds was granted a divorce from Rolla A. Reynolds.

After having disposed of all the cases on the calendar, the court adjourned Thursday, May 11.
