

TO GET HISTORY OF NORWEGIANS

Commission Will Seek to Show Their Activities in North Dakota

A complete record of the part Norwegians have played in the upbuilding of North Dakota will be published and placed in every library in Norway, under the plan adopted by the Norway Centennial commission of this state which is in charge of the exhibit for the 1914 celebration in Norway.

Alfred Gabrielson, in charge of the movement, has already begun a campaign to obtain the necessary information.

The record will be one of the most complete ever attempted of a nationality and its work in a new country. Every Norwegian who has had any part in the state's upbuilding will be given space, and not only will their accomplishments here be noted, but the record also will detail home connections in Norway, giving matters relative to the coming of the Norwegian immigrants.

History of the early Norwegian settlements in the state will be given and the record also will attempt to portray the present wealth of Norwegians in this state.

In addition to the personal record of the Norwegians of North Dakota, an exhibit of the states resources will be displayed.
