AT G. F. FAIR

Donald Campbell and Frank Paulson Captured Many Big Prizes.

Griggs county won the big premiums for horses at the Grand Forks fair last week. Frank Paulson was the big man among the Percheron horse breeders and Donald Campbell among the Clydesdale breeders.

Frank Paulson received second for stallion any age, being defeated only by the national champion. He got first for brood mare; second for mare, age class; third for two year old mare, and a special premium for mare three years or over. Finally he was awarded the gold cup awarded by the Percheron Society of America for the champion mare bred and owned by the exhibitor and the silver cup for three mares bred and owned by exhibitor. Considering the severe competition, this is a remarkable record.

Donald Campbell won the biggest prizes offered for Clydesdale. He got first for mare one year old; third for mare two years; second and fourth for mare two years; and first and second for mare any age. In breeders' division he got first and second for brood mare; first and second for dry mare; first for mare under three; first and third for four animals of same mare; and first for best four animals. He also got a prize for a three year old stallion.

Griggs county is fortunate to have men who are able to produce horses equal to the best in the country.
