

to the jury in the Hanson murder case and Mr. Englert was opening for the defense when he broke down under the nervous strain and the case will go over until Monday.

The testimony in the case tended to show that the killing of Robert Seeford, a chef at the Hotel Windsor last summer was the result of a quarrel. Two guests swore that Seeford rushed at Hanson, the night clerk who did the shooting and that the first shot was fired when he was twenty feet away and the second when they were near each other. Hanson testified that Seeford had threatened him and when he called him that morning he secured a knife and came in to the office after him and that he fired the fatal shot after Seeford had tried to seize him by the throat and was striking at him with the knife.
