

The Times is permitted to publish an account of the death of J. B. Truscott, father of Dr. Truscott, which occurred at Prince Albert, on April 18. Doctor is expected home today. In a letter to The Times he says that real estate is moving rather slowly all over western Canada this spring, and this is due to a money stringency which is expected to pass over in six months or a year. Spring is advanced there less than a week behind this vicinity. Between the line and Winnipeg, Doctor says he saw many quarter and half sections of shocks still standing in the water, that had been left unthreshed last fall; wheat which would have yielded from 20 to 25 bushels per acre.
