Hannaford Enterprise: Andrew Martinus Almklov died at the home of his brother Olaf in this village at 3:50 Saturday afternoon, September 1st 1917, after an illness extending throughout the summer months. In March, this year, he had an attack of pneumonia, and he never fully recovered from the disease as he was stricken with tuberculosis which caused his death. Since July, he has been sleeping in a tent and living out-doors continuously, but the disease had to strong hold for him to recover.

Deceased was born in Vanelvens, Prestegjeld, Norway, June 23, 1887, thus being thirty years, two months and eighteen days old at the time of his death. He came to Hannaford from Norway in 1906 and has resided in this village ever since with the exception of a few months spent in Canada on a homestead. For several years he assisted his brother in the drug store here, and the last few years he has worked at various places in town, being employed at the time he took sick in Nordeng & Alm's restaurant.

Deceased is survived by his brother Olaf, residing in this village, and by his mother, a sister and two step-sisters in Norway.

He will be missed by a large number of friends, who sincerely mourn his untimely death, and extend sympathy to his bereaved brother. His ever-cheerful and sunny disposition endeared him to all who knew him and his departure from this earth will be felt as a great bereavement not only to his near relatives but by his many friends as well.
