

Clark Holloway Dead.

Clark Holloway died at his home in Cooperstown township, Tuesday afternoon about 4 o'clock, as the result of complications ensuing from a fall in which he injured his head several days earlier. Mr. Holloway was moving a feed mill in the barn and in some manner slipped and fell the back of his head striking the hard gravel floor with considerable force. He was suffering with the grip at the time and after the accident went to bed where he remained for some days and was apparently improving. His death came unexpectedly Tuesday when he suddenly raised up in bed and fell back dead, the breaking of a blood vessel in the head being the probable cause of his sudden demise.

Mr. Holloway was 44 years of age, being born in St. Joe County, Mich., Jan. 12, 1872, and is survived by a wife and two children, a boy and a girl, and his untimely death is a hard blow to them. He was a hard and faithful worker, a good friend and neighbor of the rough and ready type honest and generous to a fault, and everybody liked "Clark," as he was familiarly called. His passing is indeed unfortunate, and a host of friends and acquaintances throughout the county deeply sympathize with the bereaved family in the loss of husband and father — Sentinel Courier.
