

Marie Leininger Dead.

Early Saturday morning, May 22, 1915, occurred the death of Miss Marie Leininger, youngest daughter of Mrs. John Leininger, of St. Paul, at the home of her sister, Mrs. Lewis Schmidt, south of town. Marie was born in Boone, Iowa, December 24, 1900 and was at the time of her death 14 years, 4 months 22 days of age. Up till about four years ago the family resided south of town, but have since made their home in St. Paul. There she attended parochial school and was confirmed this spring. The young lady was taken sick with diabetes about a year ago, that disease causing her death. Wishing and longing to see her sisters and brothers who reside here she and her mother arrived on Wednesday the 19th. Upon reaching Sutton she took very sick but remained conscious up till about Thursday evening. From that time until death came at 6:40 a. m. Saturday she was unconscious. While she has gone from the scenes, the conflicts, the sorrows and pleasures of life, she will still live in the hearts of those who knew her best. She was a kind, loving daughter, and her devotion to the family circle had no limit. Those who remain to mourn her death are her mother, two sisters, Mrs. Louis Schmidt and Mrs. Theo. Gutknecht, wife of Rev. Gutknecht, missionary, who have just returned from India for a visit, and five brothers, Michael and John, who reside here, Henry, of Boone, Iowa, and Albert and Walter of St. Paul. All the members of the family were present at the deathbed. Funeral services in German were held at the Schmidt home at 2 p. m. Tuesday and at the church at 3:30, interment being made in the cemetery south of town.
