## PAUL RORVIG PASSES AWAY

Pioneer Resident of Willow Township, Died Sunday Evening After Short Iliness.

After an illness of short duration, Paul Rorvig passed away Sunday evening at 7:00 o'clock, at his home eight miles north-east of town.

The deceased was born in Ringebo, Gulbransdalen, Norway, on the 14th day of February, 1848. At the age of 27 years he was married to Miss Anna Eielson. In the year 1884 he left his native land, came to America and located in Pope county, Minnesota, where the family lived for two years, when they moved on a homestead in Griggs county, a short distance east of their present home.
