surier the consequences. Rev. W. L. Bennett, of the Methodist church of Cooperstown, spoke to a large gathering at the Odd Fellow's hall last Friday evening, and also to the school children during the afternoon. Mr. Bennett was born and raised in Newfoundland, and his talk was confined to the customs and industries of that north country. He related many incidents of intense hardships which are encountered on the fishing and seal hunting expeditions, and on many of the perilous trips a large number of the men lost their lives in the storms and ice floes. He emphasized the unwavering faith of the inhabitants in God, and said that the churches are the social centers for its people. His talk was very interesting and instructive.
