## "Pair of Artists" and Binford Band Made Big Hit With Sutton People.

Boeckman and Frances Ringlee, as college chums were quite good, the latter playing a humorous part which he handled well. The remaining lady character, who was another Binford teacher, also played a part that was well suited to her. Also the juvenile character, the foolish boy, was acted admirably. The sum received from the admissions to the play and the dance given after it, amounted to over \$75. They are preparing another play to be given in Binford in a few weeks. We do not know whether they will come to Sutton or not but if they do they should be well patronized.
