

The festival held in the Lutheran church, Sunday morning, was very well attended. The services were held in commemoration of the 400th anniversary of the Reformation. The cantata was sung by a chorus of 50 voices, composed of Binford and Cooperstown singers, under the able leadership of Mrs. Langlie. Rev. Thorgrimson of Grand Forks sang the baritone solos. He has a very pleasing voice and delighted his audience. Miss Morten, vocal instructor at Concordia college, sang the soprano solos. She possesses a powerful voice and sang well. The address was delivered by Rev. Thorgrimson, who gave an interesting account of the early Lutheran church history.
