

The worst blizzard that has visited North Dakota in the past ten years, started last Saturday night and continued all day Sunday, tying up railroad traffic until hardly a wheel was turned on practically a foot of railroad in the state. A young blizzard visited this section last Wednesday and Thursday, sufficient to tie up the railroad traffic on this branch, and with Sunday's storm, which completely filled some of the cuts, there is no telling when the train will reach the end of the line at McHenry. The road was opened as far as Cooperstown yesterday and mail and express for that city and the towns north, has been delivered to that point. A carrier arrived here yesterday from Hannaford with mail which had been directed over the Great Northern. That was the first which had reached Binford for exactly a week. Efforts are being made to get the train this week. In Binford nothing of a serious nature has, as yet, developed, but the flour supply is getting very low, and unless trains are run this week, the situation is apt to become very grave. At Jessie the coal supply is about exhausted. No mail has been sent out of Binford for the past seven days.
