

DRAFT FIGURES ARE PUBLISHED

Twenty-Seven Binford Registrants Are Given Their Serial Numbers.

The newly assigned serial numbers for those who have registered for the U. S. army have been given out and the list of those in Binford is given below. No definite announcement as to the exact date when the drawing will begin has been received. As soon as the numbers have been drawn the men holding these numbers will be notified to appear before the board for examination, first physical and then as to claims for exemption. The war department's plans call for one-third of the men to appear before the board each day, for three successive days. Rules and regulations received by the county exemption board for the conduct of the selective draft explain fully on what claims exemption can be based. The district boards and not the county boards will determine what industrial occupation will entitle a man to exemption. The local boards will pass this feature over to the district or state board after this claim has been filed. These boards will decide exemption claims of "persons engaged in industries, including agriculture, found to be necessary to the maintenance of the military establishment or the effective operation of the military forces, or the maintenance of the national interest during the emergency."
