

HENRY DEEHR IN AUTO ACCIDENT

Auto Turned Over on Grade Near Tolna—Car Was Badly Damaged.

Tolna Tribune: On Friday morning after the dance while taking Miss Christine Schindele home, Henry Deehr had what might well have been a fatal accident, when his car, a forty-horse Inter-State, skidded at the top of the hill north of town and went off the high grade at the bottom, turning completely over.

It appears that the car struck something at the top of the hill and started skidding, Mr. Deehr being unable to get it under control until the grade was reached at the bottom where the car, striking only the edge of the grade, turned completely over on its seats among the stones in the ditch. Miss Schindele was thrown clear of the car and received only a slight scratch on the face. Mr. Deehr remained in the driver's seat with the car on top of him and was unconscious. Miss Schindele immediately ran to town, only about 50 rods, and secured the help of two or three men and called Dr. Heron. Upon arriving at the scene, the men tipped the car back on it's side, and extracted Mr. Deehr who was still unconscious and soaked with gasoline. He was then taken to the home of Mr. and Mrs. Geo. Halvorson, where he was put under the care of Dr. Heron.

It was at first thought that several ribs were broken, but Dr. says now he thinks not. However, he has a very sore side and bruised face and a severe blow on the head rup-

tured blood vessels in the eyes, leaving them in bad shape.

The car is now in the automobile hospital with a broken wind shield, radiator, seat, steering wheel, and fenders and one bursted tire.
