Exemption Board Finished Work.

The district exemption board, which after several weeks of continuous work of from ten to fifteen hours a day, has finally caught up in its work and has taken a recess. Since the board has been in session they have passed upon no less than 4,000 industrial claims and appeal cases.

Each individual case requires the scrutiny of many affidavits and statements and sometimes personal investigation of the cases in question. Considerable time has also been devoted by the board to hearing appeals for exemption by claimants who appear before the board in person. Notwithstanding the tediousness of their task, the members of the board have sacrificed personal business to devote all their time to the work of the board.

When the board adjourned it had cleaned up practically all the work before it. County boards have started to make their certifications of the second contingent of men called to fill their respective quotas to the district board, and it will be only a matter of o few days in the opinion of Chairman L. E. Birdzell, before the board will have to meet again. Chairman Birdzell estimates that they will have to get together again about the latter part of the week.
