

DISTRICT COURT HAS ADJOURNED

Ten Cases on the Calendar—Two Continued and Two Settled Out of Court.

District court convened at Cooperstown, Dec. 13 and adjourned last Saturday. The following persons were admitted to citizenship: Gabriel Ness, Thorvald Bolstad and Christian Gronneberg.

The appeal from the decision in justice court of H. S. Rearick was tried and the verdict of the lower court was sustained. The case was against Marion Kalts, a peddler who had no license. Kalts was sentenced to pay a fine.

The case against Olof Hagen, who was alleged to have sold mortgaged property resulted in a verdict against the defendant, who was required to pay a fine of one dollar and costs.

The suit brought by R. E. Champ-
lin against E. P. Rovig was settled out of court.

The case of Lewis Berg against the Great Western Grain Co. was continued over term.

The action brought by the Farmers State Bank of Walum against Swen and Nicolai Boe was settled out of court.

Another case settled out of court was that of Serene Tufteland against John Aarestad.

The case of Pratt Bros. vs. the Huber Threshing Machine Co. was tried and judgment was secured against the Pratt Bros. The action grew out of a machine deal in which it was alleged that the machine was not as represented by the company.

In the case of C. E. Peterson vs. G. W. Getts, the plaintiff secured judgment.

The case of Emma Skaar against Iver Skaar was continued.

Mrs. Clara Peterson won the case started against her by the Robinson-Strauss Co.
