Hannaford Enterprise: Last Thursday this community was visited by a hail storm which did thousands of dollars of damage. The one consolation is that the damage was done in a comparatively small area and in places, even where some hail fell, the crops will not be totally destroyed. The storm came from the northwest and travelled in a southeasterly direction, apparently following very closely the G. N. right-of-way. The damage from hail started in just east of Revere and continued in a path about a mile and a half to two miles wide as far as about four miles east of Hannaford. In this stretch the crops were practically wiped off clean, the farmers on the north side of the tracks being hit harder than those on the south side. Hannaford was on the edge of the storm as more harm was done in the north edge of town than in the south part, and a few miles south of town there was neither wind, hail nor rain. Window lights facing west were shattered in most of the buildings unless they were protected by screens. Very few of the farmers hailed out were protected by insurance.
