Jessie to the Front.

The Courier-News contained the following news from Jessie: little town of Jessie is fast coming to the front as one of the principal grain markets of North Dakota. Located in Griggs county, right in the heart of the grain belt, and with good elevator facilities, it has been growing very rapidly during the past few years. The three large elevators located there have handled 412,000 bushels of grain since Sept. 1, 1915, and expect to handle 150,000 bushels during the balance of the season. A total of 245 cars of grain have been shipped since Sept. 1, and there is considerable stored grain still in the elevators. . These figures are far in excess of any previous year in the history of Jessie. Not only is there a large quantity of grain grown around this flourishing little town, but the quality is the best, as is evidenced by the fact that Norman McCulloh, a pioneer farmer of that locality, was awarded four prizes at the recent Grain Growers' Convention in Fargo. These prizes were presented by the Duluth board of trade and were first in blue stem and three seconds in barley, winter rye and white Russian oats.
