Single Tax Experiment.

F. E. Packard, tax commissioner of North Dakota, says that if the assessment in 1918 is made under senate bill No. 49, passed by the legislature, "it will be the nearest legal approach to the single tax idea in the United States."

The new law provides that all land, town and city lots, railroads, bank stocks and express and telegraph companies shall be assessed at 30 per cent of their actual value; that all household goods and house equipment and wearing apparel, structures, and improvements on farm lands shall be assessed at 5 per cent of their actual value; while all other property shall be assessed at 20 per cent of its value. Cities and towns may also assess the improvement on real estate at 5 per cent of actual value, if they so elect.
