
Former Resident Starts Suit.

Alfred Hoff, who was employed by Greenland, Pritz & Co., as bookkeeper for several years, and left here about two years ago to accept a position as a life insurance agent, with F. C. McDonald, who was at that time soliciting insurance in this neighborhood for the Kansas City Life, has started suit to recover \$500 which Hoff gave to McDonald as a bond. The following account of the suit appeared in last Saturday's Courier-News:

"Requisition papers were granted to John C. Ross, sheriff of Cass county, on the governor of Nebraska for the return of F. C. McDonald to face a charge of obtaining money under false pretenses in the court in Cass county. The charge is preferred by Alfred Hoff, who alleges that he deposited \$500 with McDonald as a bond to solicit insurance for a company of which McDonald was agent, and that McDonald, when Hoff quit the company, refused to pay the \$500."
