

NEW LOAN LAW HELPS FARMERS

Those Who Get Loans From School Fund Are Relieved of Much Trouble.

Farmers who borrow money from the state school fund will hereafter be relieved of much trouble and embarrassment in procuring loans. The new law which becomes effective July 1st, provides that when a loan is authorized by the board, the state auditor shall draw his warrant in favor of the county treasurer of the county in which the loan is made for the amount of the loan. The county treasurer shall obtain and file with the proper officers the releases necessary to release the land from all encumbrances and pay the balance to the person borrowing the money, providing all incumbrances have been paid and all the mortgages and releases are recorded. This will not only relieve the farmer from making short loan in order to clear the title of his land before obtaining the new loan but will save him also time and money.

Following are some of the important bills which become effective on July 1st. Legalizing Sunday baseball; authorizing the payment of \$50,000 pensions to the soldiers who served on the Mexican border; \$30,000 to indemnify the owners of horses killed on account of glanders and durine; providing for a depositors guarantee fund to guarantee payment of general deposits; repealing of wolf bounty law; granting the women the right to vote for certain officers; prohibiting glaring headlights on automobiles; providing for the dragging of the roads in each township; providing for a uniform state grade for wheat, oats, barley, flax and other grain; prohibiting auctioneers from selling property on which the taxes have not been paid; prohibiting the shipment of intoxicant liquors within or into the state.
