

# FARMERS TO BUY McHENRY PAPER

Farmers' Tribune Publishing Company Organized—To Enlarge Paper.

The farmers living tributary to McHenry have formed a corporation to purchase the publishing business of the McHenry Tribune, and it is expected that within a few weeks that paper will be under their control.

The new organization formed for the purpose of taking over the Tribune is the farmers Tribune Publishing company, and the board of directors consists of the following prominent farmers in that vicinity: Henry Pewe, Samuel Lyman, H. B. Ommedal, John Leonard, John Dybwad of Glenfield, Gust Top of Grace City, and S. O. Hoverskland of Hammar.

As soon as the transfer is made it is possible that a new linotype will be installed and other improvements made, for those interested hope to make the Tribune one of the best and biggest newspapers in the country.

The new corporation was formed at a meeting of the Paradise Farmers' club, held in the Lyman school house north of McHenry on Saturday evening. A large number of Farmers were present at the meeting and much enthusiasm was manifested in the new venture. At this meeting steps were also taken by the club to purchase binder twine in carload lots, and to do cooperative purchasing of coal.
