Sherbrooke, N. D., Nov. 6, 1897.

At 1 o'clock p. m., the county auditor called to his assistance County Commissioners Rindy and Cochrane and County Treasurer S. H. Nelson, for the purpose of canvassing the votes cast in the first and fourth commissioner districts of Steele county, N. D., on the 2nd day of November 1897, for a county commissioner for each of said districts.

On motion H. J. Rindy was elected chairman.
