

## Crop Report for the Past Week.

**Barnes**—The past week has been noted for heavy rains; never has the country had such a drenching in the memory of the oldest inhabitant; the damage to the crop cannot be estimated now.

**Benson**—Plenty of rain since the 16th has helped the crop out wonderfully. Gophers have taken part of some good pieces.

**Bottineau**—Crops are looking somewhat better since the showers of the past week. The weather is all that could be wished for now for some of the crop.

**Burleigh**—Rains of past week were of great benefit to grain of all kinds and also gardening. Wheat filling very well but uneven on the ground.

**Cass**—The past week has been very unfavorable for crops; all the low lands are flooded and it is probable that much grain is damaged.

**Cavaller**—Crops are doing well but we have had too much rain. More damage to hay than anything else. Slight damage by hail.

**Dickey**—Rained for two days continuously during the past week and the soil is in a soaked condition and looks as though late grain would now make a good crop.

**Eddy**—Week has been a wet one; has rained four days and the largest amount of water fallen for a long time.

**Grand Forks**—Rain for a week steadily; Wheat is turning yellow, rusty and badly smutted.

**Griggs**—Cloudy and cool most of the week has benefited crops and partially revived them from effects of hot winds of previous week. Heaviest rain of the season the past week.

**LaMoure**—Crops are generally looking well but a good deal of wheat will be quite late.

**Stada**—The past week has been cool with an unusually heavy rainfall which was much needed but we now have moisture enough to guarantee an average crop.

**Trail**—The week past has been very wet and cloudy; there is no water standing on the fields in this locality but not calm weather would damage crops of all kinds.
