Bottineau-Crops are looking somewhat better since the showers of the past week. The weather is all that could be wished for now for some of the crop.

Burleigh-Rains of past week were of great benefit to grain of all kinds and also gardeng. Wheat filling very well

but uneven on the ground,

Cass-The past week has been very unfavorable for crops; all the low lands are flooded and it is probable that much grain is damaged. Cavalier-Crops are doing well but we

have had too much rain. More damage to hay than anything else. Slight dam-

age by hail.

Dickey-Rained for two days continuously during the past week and the soil is in a soaked condition and looks as though late grain would now make a good crop.

Eddy-Week has been a wet one; has rained four days and the largest amount

of water fallen for a dong time. Grand Forks—Rain for a week stead-

ily; Wheat is turning yellow, rusty and badly smutted.

La Moure Crops are generally looking well but a good deal of wheat will be quite late.
