

Word reaches us from Page that Henry Green lost his barn, granary, 600 bushels of wheat, 200 of oats, 6 horses, 2 cows and several tons of hay, by fire, last Friday night. The fire pointed to incendiary, and as Mr. Green had some trouble with a neighbor by the name of Wm. Fisher, steps were taken to look into the loss very careful. Foot prints were tracked from the barn to the house of Mr. Fisher, who lives alone, and he was at once arrested and placed under \$2,000 bail. We further learn that Fisher has partially confessed to the crime; but we do not verify the latter statement. It is said that Fisher shut all of the doors and windows in the barn and started the fire in the hay above, thus smothering the stock below. It is terrible to think of, and if Fisher is guilty, the law cannot be too severe. He should be sent up for life at hard-very hard labor. That is a poor way to get even.
