
MASS MEETING.

Hope, N. D., Feb. 13th. 1896.

At a meeting of the business men and citizens of Hope, held this day in the Town Hall. J. J. Wamberg was elected chairman and J. M. Stewart, Secretary.

After a somewhat free and easy discussion of the necessity of a Business Men's Union and the necessity of working for immigrants to settle up our vacant lands, which was conceded to be of mutual benefit and interest to each and all in our immediate community, it was decided that we be represented in the meeting of the State B. M. U. to be held in Grand Forks Feb 18th.

Hon. J. J. Wamberg having business in Grand Forks at that time with the Railway Commission, volunteered to be one of the representation, as it would be somewhat saving in expense. On motion H. H. Waseem and G. A. Luce were elected as delegates with Mr. Wamberg to represent us at the meeting of the S. B. M. U. Each person present volunteered to give one dollar, each, towards defraying expenses of delegates and on motion J. M. Stewart was made a committee of one to receive the funds from the volunteers.

On motion, Resolved that as many of our people as possibly can should attend the Immigration Convention at Sherbrooke, Feby. 27th.

Meeting adjourned to meet upon call of the chairman, when all farmers and persons interested in the advancement of our community will be duly notified through the press.
