PASSED AWAY SUDDENLY ON SUNDAY MORNING AT BEACH, NORTH DAKOTA.

The people of this community were shocked to learn that Mrs. William Bond died on Sunday morning, December 6th, at her home at Beach, North Dakota.

Mrs. Loren Syverson was the first to hear the sad news and she left Sunday evening for Beach to do what she could to relieve the sorrow of the stricken husband and children.

Rachael Howard was born in Kentucky thirty-seven years ago and sixteen years ago next month she was married to William Bond and for a number of years they resided in this community where they have a large circle of friends. Last summer they moved to Beach, in the western part of the state, where Mrs. Bond died on Sunday. Two children were born to them, Pearl and Lloyd, aged respectively 15 and 12 years, and these together with Mr. Bond are left

to mourn the loss of a devoted wife and mother.

The remains of Mrs. Bond and her infant babe were laid to rest in the cemetery at Beach on Tuesday.
