In a note, which was found with the body, addressed to his father and brother, Doughtery stated that the act was the result of a nervous collapse.

A second note which was found later showed that he had intended to end his life on Wed-

nesday, the 23rd, but that his nerve had failed him at that time.

After cutting his throat Dougherty held a bucket between his knees and caught the blood in it until he lost consciousness when he evidently toppled over and the blood was slashed over the room.

BODY COLD IN DEATH

The act was committed in Dougherty's room in the rear of K. A. Buchanan and F. H. Keeler, alarmed because he had not started for Barrie, where he was sceduled to preach in the mornning, broke in the door about 8 o'clock had found the body which was already cold.

Dougherty was 20 years of age and is survived by his father, who lives at Kansas City, Kan., and a brother, who lives at Kansas City.

Coroner Todd of Jamestown was called to view the remains and he decided that an inquest was unnecessary as it was a plain case of suicide.
