

C. A. EDWARDS DEAD

C. A. EDWARDS PASSES QUIETLY AWAY AT HIS HOME IN COURTENAY ON WEDNESDAY.

Death came to C. A. Edwards yesterday morning at 4 o'clock at his home at Courtenay after a struggle for months with that dread disease, consumption. He went down to Somerset, Wis., on Jan. 26th to consult a specialist and returning to his home on Jan. 29th, both he and his wife expressed themselves as being pleased with the apparent benefit of his trip, but on Monday morning he was taken worse and a physician called, but all efforts were in vain as he passed quietly away Wednesday morning.

Clarence Arthur Edwards comes from a family of sixteen and was born in Washburn, Grant county, Wis., on Oct. 18, 1866, left Wisconsin for Iowa at the age of 13 and came to Oakes, N. D., in 1887, and engaged in farming. Was married to Grace Anderson on Jan. 27, 1889 and came to Courtenay nine years ago and has resided here since, was proprietor of a livery barn here for 3 years, after which he took up painting and paper hanging.

The funeral services were held today at the Presbyterian church at 2 o'clock p. m., conducted by Rev. M. S. Riddle. The choir rendered several beautiful selections, among them "Rock of Ages," "Blest be the Tie that Binds," "Abide with Me," "Come Unto Me," and "Saved by Grace."

Deceased leaves his wife and three children, Clarence, Emma and Graddon, who will greatly feel this loss, as to them he was ever a devoted husband and father.

He was a quiet, kindly, and genial man and the sincere sympathy of his friends will go out to his widow and children, whose loss they, in a measure, share and deeply feel.
