AN APPROPRIATE MEMORIAL

HANDSOME SILVER SERVICE TO BE BOUGHT FOR THE BATTLESHIP NORTH DAKOTA.

The State whose name is given to a battleship is honored by the act, and North Dakota has been honored by the selection of her name for the great Battleship North Dakota, the finest of our navy, which will go into commission about the first of the year. It is the universal custom that some recognition of such honor be shown by the presentation of a suitable memorial which shall become a part of the furnishings of the ship.

It is impossible to use state funds for this purpose, and, as it is evident that such a gift, to have real value, and to fulfil its proper purpose, should be made by the people generally, the governor of the state has appointed a committee to select a proper memorial and arrange for the collection of a large number of small subscriptions to defray the cost. The committee named consists of the following representative gentlemen: Hon. E. Y. Sarles, Hon. Frank White, Hon. Roger Allin, Hon. W. A. Scott, Hon. Geo. B. Winship, Hon. Martin Jacobson, Hon. John Bruegger, Hon. F. L. Thompson, Hon. Frank Lish.

The committee has organized for work, has decided tentatively on a silver service as the best gift that can be made, has asked for designs, and has undertaken to raise a fund of \$10,000 which will pay for a present of value and beauty in keeping with the magnificence of the vessel and the dignity of the state.

For convenience of collection the state is being divided into a number of small districts, and every person will have an opportunity to contribute his mite. Subscription lists will soon be out, and receipts will be issued from the central office for all sums received. In addition to this the names of all donors will be engrossed and the sheets will be bound to become a part of the permanent records of the ship.
