

GONE TO HER REWARD

MRS. ELIZABETH SYVERSON DIED WEDNESDAY MORNING, FEB. 17TH. FUNERAL HELD ON FRIDAY.

At 9 o'clock Wednesday morning, February 17th, 1909, occurred the death of Mrs. Elizabeth Syverson at the home of her son, David. Mrs. Syverson was well advanced in years and death was due to old age, she being apparently well up to the time of her departure. She was born in Tennessee on the 7th of May, 1827, and at the time of her death was 81 years, 9 months and 17 days old. At an early age she removed with her parents to Illinois where she resided until the time of her marriage to Mr. Suit Syverson, in 1854, when she went with her husband to Wisconsin. It was while here that the death of her husband occurred, Mr. Syverson expiring in the year 1885.

She remained in Wisconsin until 1902 when she came to North Dakota and resided with her son, David, until the time of her death.

Mrs. Syverson was the mother of a family of ten children, eight of whom are now living to mourn her departure: Loren, David and Will Syverson, Mrs. Joe Walker and Mrs. Peterson, all residents of Courtenay; Mrs. Sanford of Black River Falls, Wis., Daniel and Dennis Syverson of Steuben, Wis.

The funeral was held on Friday from the Presbyterian church, Rev. Kline conducting the services in the presence of a large number of sorrowing friends and relatives of the deceased. The remains were laid to rest in the cemetery south of town. The sympathy of a large number of friends goes out to those who most deeply feel the loss of somebody who held a high place in their affections—the departure of a kind and loving mother.
