

## DEATH OF HANS G. PETERSON

THE FARGO FORUM OF MONDAY GIVES THE FOLLOWING ACCOUNT OF THE DEATH OF HANS PETERSON, FORMERLY OF COURTENAY.

A jury impanelled by Coroner Vincent of Clay county was in session this afternoon hearing evidence touching the death of Hans G. Peterson of Walum, Griggs county, N. D., whose lifeless body was found in the A. J. Rustad saloon early Sunday morning.

The body of the unfortunate man was found by an employee of Mr. Rustad when he entered the saloon yesterday morning to attend to the fires and the death was at once reported to Chief Malvey and Coroner Vincent. Mr. Peterson had been in town about ten days. For a long time he had been suffering from acute asthma and he told his friends he had spent about \$1,000 for medicine and treatment. It had been stated that the deceased had been drinking a good deal but that is positively denied by more than one person. He was seen about the Rustad establishment Saturday night and when the place was closed at 11 o'clock he was no where about and it was presumed that he had gone to the hotel where he was staying.

### FOUND BY A BARTENDER

After leaving the place one of the bartenders had occasion to return to attend to a matter he had overlooked and he heard a heavy breathing sound coming from a small room and entering the latter he found Mr. Peterson sound asleep and going to the outer door the bartender advised with one of the night officers and it was decided to let the man sleep on and he was not disturbed. When the employees returned Sunday morning to attend to the fire and clean up as usual his body was found just as it was seen the night previous, but the spark of life had flown. Dr. Humphrey, who viewed the body about 10 o'clock yesterday morning, gave it as his opinion that the man had been dead about four hours and that the dis-

solution was from natural causes.

### IN GOOD CIRCUMSTANCES

Mr. Peterson was a man of large physique and between 50 and 60 years of age. The authorities learned over the phone from friends at the man's home that he was the proprietor of a billiard hall and was a man with a grown up family, four children at least, adult daughters. It was also stated that he was, or had been a deputy sheriff of Griggs county. Letters on his person found by Coroner Vincent proved particulars as to the man's friends. It is alleged that the unfortunate man was in comfortable circumstances and he often declared that he would give any thing if he could be relieved of his trouble.
