

## GONE TO HER REST.

MISS MARGIE ALBERTA THOMPSON PASSED PEACEFULLY AWAY ON SATURDAY AFTERNOON AT THREE O'CLOCK AFTER A LINGERING ILLNESS.

"God have mercy, I want to die." These were the last words of Miss Margie Alberta Thompson as she passed from this life on Saturday afternoon at her home south of Kensal. She had been a patient sufferer and when the end came she was ready to go.

Miss Margie Alberta Thompson was born at Winchester, Indiana, July 11, 1884 and died September 1, 1906, being twenty-two years, one month and twenty days old. She came with her parents to North Dakota several years ago and was educated in the schools of this state. She taught her first term in 1901 and continued teaching until her resignation of the Kensal school on October 1, 1905, on account of poor health, leaving two months later for El Paso, Texas, where she remained until June 1, 1906. She was a consistent member of the Episcopal church and was baptized by Bishop Mann on December 18, 1905. She was a sincere christian and although her life was short she left behind her many noble deeds that will keep her memory fresh as long as her friends and relatives live.

The funeral was held from the family residence on Monday and interment took place in the Kensal cemetery, Rev. Mr. Stinson officiating and spoke from Revelations 14th chapter and 13th. verse. The remains were followed to their last resting place by a large number of sorrowing friends and many tears were shed over the grave of the departed one.

Besides a host of friends she leaves her father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Thompson, and her brothers and sisters, John D. Thompson, George H. Thompson, Andy Thompson, Mary, Gladys and Agnes Thompson and Mrs. George S. Livermore of Swea City, Iowa.
