In the evening there was speaking by the visiting ministers in both English and Norwegian and singing by the choir and a duet by M. H. Hanson and Miss Hattie Halverson and a solo by Mr. Hanson.

All of these services were largely attended and much interest manifested.

The accompanying half tone is a very good likeness of the church building. It was erected last summer at a cost of about \$3,800 and has a seating capacity of about 150. It is furnished with a nice pulpit and comfortable seats, the latter being set on a slightly raised floor, the furniture and wood work being finished in golden oak and presenting a very hand-some appearance.
